Subject: What happens if TRORC fails to get 60% of its commissioners to vote in favor of the draft?
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There's language within the draft proposal for TRORC stating that in order for it to pass 60% of the commissioners must vote in favor. What happens if TRORC fails to get 60% of its commissioners to vote in favor of the draft?

If every town in TRORC gets one vote then 18 need to vote in favor of the draft to move on to the next step. Kevin Geiger said they need fewer than 18 because some towns don't have commissioners, which of course raises additional questions about proper representation, namely:

- 1) Which towns do not currently have commissioners?
- 2) What are the prerequisites to become a commissioner?
- 3) How can the people within a town receive proper representation?
- 4) How can plans be made (legally) which affect populations that lack representation?

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
